Breathing air with radon increases your risk of getting lung cancer over the course of your lifetime.

Testing is the only way to know if your home has a radon problem that needs to be fixed.



Radon enters your home through the soil or water.

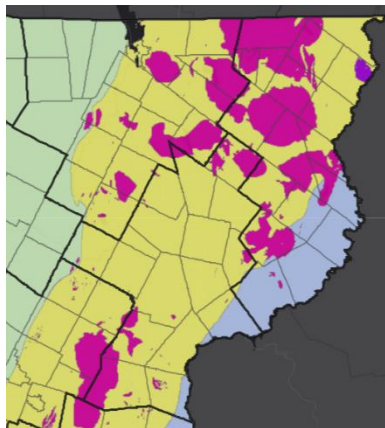
Free long-term radon in air test kits are available to Northeast Kingdom
