



## What's Next?

## Location

Strategically located at the midpoint of the most heavily used segment of the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail (LVRT), the park will connect four thriving communities: St. Johnsbury, Hardwick, Danville Village, and West Danville. Designed to serve both local residents and trail users, the park will provide a much-needed outdoor resource for dog owners and families alike.
